

MoU between ISU and WIA-E on Cooperation to Support Education in Aerospace Related Activities

Strasbourg, France: The International Space University (ISU) and Women in Aerospace – Europe (WIA-E) sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to seal their existing long-term collaboration and provide a framework for future cooperation.

ISU and WIA-E affirm their common interest in pursuing the highest quality standard in education and professional development in subjects related to the peaceful exploration, development and utilization of space. Some modes of potential collaboration include WIA-E members teaching in the educational programs of ISU, including the ISU Master program, the Space Studies Program, whereas WIA-E may invite ISU faculty and lecturers to deliver seminars in their conferences.
